

There has been much speculation as to the origins of 'the little phrase' that not only bewitched Swann, the protagonist of the novel's first volume, but also prompted from Proust the most exquisite descriptions of music and the elusive, ecstatic feelings it inspires. Sonatas by Saint-Saëns, Gabriel Pierné and **Debussy** and two songs without words by **Reynaldo Hahn** make up the CD and create the spirit of intangible memories and desires. 

The Dutch Music Prize is the top award for classical musicians in the Netherlands and is given each year by the Ministry of Education,

Culture and Science to an artist who has entered an intensive course of development for a period of approximately two years.
